| Title I Part A | Economically Disadvantaged | This funding provides supplemental resources to help schools with high concentrations of students from low-income families to provide a high quality education that will enable all children to meet or exceed the state's student performance standards. |
| Title I Part C | Migrant | This funding provides supplemental resources to support programs that help migrant students overcome the challenges of mobility, cultural and language barriers, and other difficulties associated with a migratory lifestyle. |
| Title I Part D | Juvenile Delinquency | This funding provides supplemental resources designed to improve the educational service to children in facilities for delinquent so that these students will have the opportunity to acquire the knowledge and skills contained in the state content standards. |
| Title II Part A | Staff Development | This funding provides supplemental resources to improve student achievement through elevating teacher and principal quality through recruitment, hiring, and retention strategies and to increase the number of highly qualified teachers in the classroom and highly qualified administrators in schools. |
| Title III LEP | Limited English Proficient | This funding provides supplemental resources to schools to ensure that children who are limited English proficient attain English proficiency at high levels in core academic subjects to meet or exceed state mandated achievement performance standards. |
| Title III IM | Immigrant | This funding provides supplemental resources to schools to ensure a smooth transition for children who are new to the country to prepare the children to meet or exceed state mandated achievement performance standards. |
| Title IV | Well-rounded education Healthy and safe schools Effective use of technology | This funding provides supplemental resources to schools to improve academic achievement by increasing capacity of LEAs to provide access to, and opportunities for, a well-rounded education for all students. Title IV funds are provided to improve school conditions for student learning in order to create a healthy and safe school environment; and to improve access to personalized learning experiences supported by technology and professional development for the effective use of data and technology. |
