Overview of Dual Credit

Curriculum	Lone Star College coursework; accepted by in-state colleges and universities; may not be accepted by out-of-state and private institutions
Courses Offered	Approximately 11 courses on HS campuses; taken freshman - senior year; most students begin junior year
Participation Requirements	Students must earn qualifying scores on: EOC/course grade combo, TSIA2, PSAT/NMSQT, SAT, and/or ACT
College Credit	Credits and grades earned are recorded on Lone Star transcript; transfer to in-state, public college/universities
Instructors	LSC-K professors, high school teachers serving as adjunct professors, or hybrid model
Cost	\$0 Tuition; Students pay for textbooks if required

Dual Credit Courses Selection

All Dual Credit Courses are dependent upon enrollment and teacher availability.

Students may take pre-approved dual credit courses over the summer. This is necessary for those interested in completing the core 42 hours of curriculum.

Important To Know

<u>Grades</u> in dual credit classes become a permanent part of the student's college record. New Caney ISD and Lone Star College have different grading scales.

<u>Courses</u> are mostly taught at the high school campus during the regular school day. Students do not need to travel to the college for class.

Maintaining a college grade of "C" or better is required to remain in the program.

<u>Pass/Fail:</u> Students <u>cannot</u> pass/fail a dual credit course.

Academic Calendars for college and high school do not allign. (think: fall and winter break, spring break, etc)

<u>Withdrawal</u> from a dual credit course requires notification from the student, high school, and completion of drop forms. The LSC college calendar has drop dates that are essential for dropping a course without a grade on the student's college transcript.

<u>Credit Transfer</u>— Courses may not transfer to all universities. Please verify with the college of choice: www.lonestar.edu/university-transfer-guide.htm

Dual Credit Plans

Choose between two plans:

College Essentials

This includes 6 classes typically included in degrees offered at Texas public universities.

Courses are typically taken during the junior and senior year of high school.

- Courses include:
 - ENGL 1301 and ENGL 1302
 - o HIST 1301 & 1302
 - o GOVT 2305 & 2306
 - Could also take 1 creative arts class such as ARTS, DRAM or MUSI.



Core Complete

Includes 14 college courses (42 college credit hours) in 9 component areas guaranteed by law to transfer to Texas public universities. Sec. 61.822(c)

Courses are typically taken over all 4 years of high school including summer.

- Courses include:
 - o Communication (6 SCH)
 - Mathematics (3 SCH)
 - Life & Physical Sciences (8 SCH)
 - Component Area (4 SCH)
 - Language, Philosophy, & Culture (3 SCH)
 - Creative Arts (3 SCH)
 - Social/Behavioral Sciences (3 SCH)
 - History (6 SCH)
 - Government/Political Science (6 SCH)
